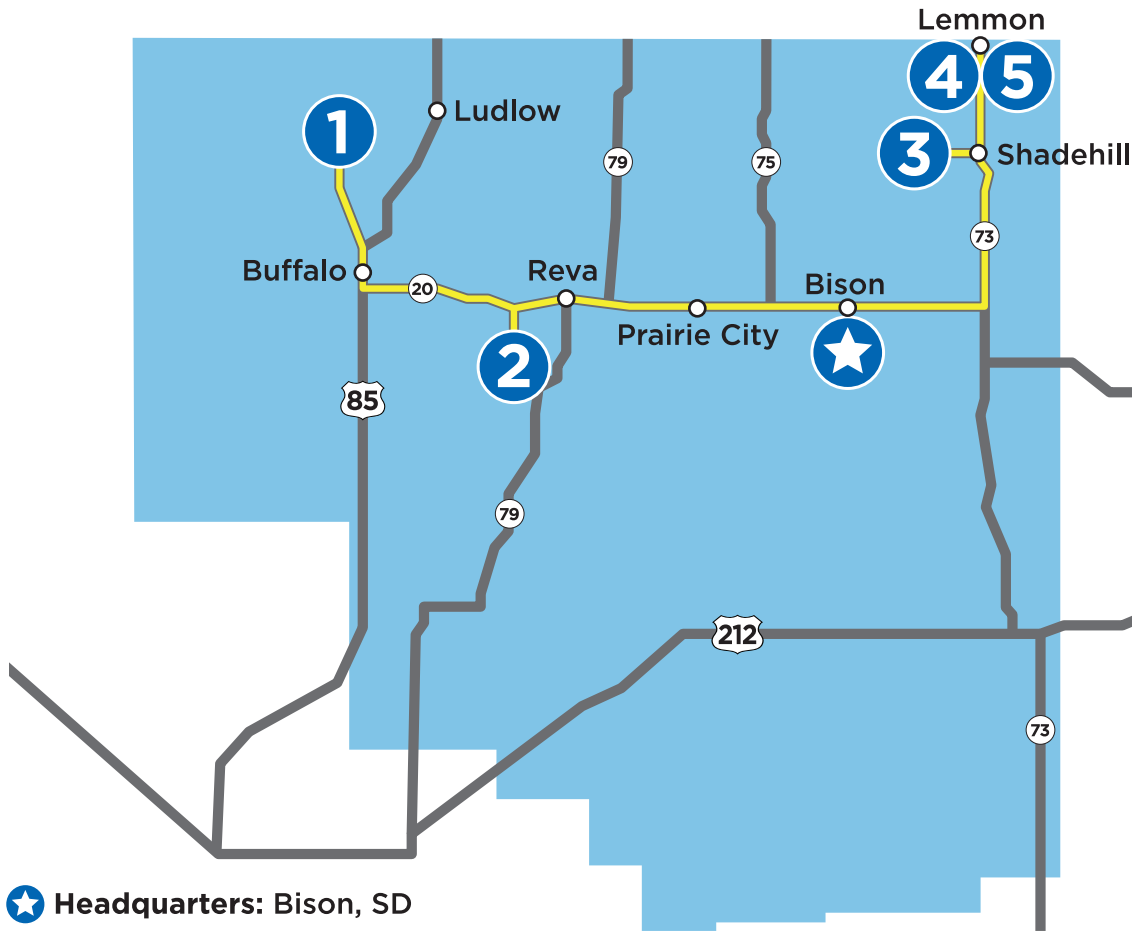


Co-op Country ROAD TRIP MAP

Featured Road Trip Stops

1 Cave Hills National Forest

Near Ludlow (GPS: 45.833, -103.467)

Category: Outdoors/History

Explore scenic buttes, rugged trails and unique rock formations throughout the Cave Hills National Forest. Visitors can also discover Native American rock art and imagery preserved within the area, offering a glimpse into the region's cultural history. Guests are encouraged to respect and help preserve these important historical sites.

2 Slim Buttes National Forest

Near Ludlow (GPS: 45.489, -103.187)

Category: Outdoors/History

Take in sweeping views, hike through unique rock formations like The Castles and Battleship and explore the historic Battle of the Slim Buttes Monument. The area highlights both the natural beauty of northwest South Dakota and the history of the Great Sioux War of 1876.

3 Shadehill Reservoir

Category: Outdoors/Recreation

Spend the day fishing, boating, camping or relaxing along the shoreline at Shadehill Reservoir. With wide-open views and plenty of space for outdoor recreation, it's a favorite destination for family fun in northwest South Dakota.

4 Petrified Wood Park

500 Main Ave, Lemmon

Category: History/Attraction

Walk through one of the world's largest collections of petrified wood at this unique Lemmon attraction built during the Great Depression. The park and museum showcase the geology, history and craftsmanship that helped shape the region and its communities.

5 Grand River Museum

114 10th Street W, Lemmon

Category: History/Attraction

See real dinosaur fossils, frontier exhibits and Native American history all in one stop at the Grand River Museum. This free, family-friendly attraction offers visitors a closer look at the stories, people and landscapes that shaped northwest South Dakota and the Grand River region.
